It's a place to relax and cool down for the summer, but there are rules at the pool everyone should know.

Children up to 10 years old must be accompanied by an

adult, at least 18 years old, according to Mr. Mike Eberdt, Outdoor Recreation manager.

Children ages 11 to 13 can go to the pool unsupervised if the child takes a swim class and acquires a swimmer's card with his parent's approval, Mr. Eberdt said.

The pool is open from noon to 8 p.m., Tuesday to Sunday and is free for Team Holloman

members and military identification cardholders.

The pool can be reserved for parties from 9 p.m. to midnight Fridays and Saturdays.


