Pilot in F-16 mishap released from hospital, investigation ongoing

HOLLOMAN AIR FORCE BASE, N.M. – The pilot who safely ejected from an F-16 Fighting Falcon earlier today is in good condition and has been released from a local hospital.

The fighter jet assigned to the 49th Wing crashed at approximately 11:50 a.m. in the White Sands National Park around five miles west of the base.

Holloman personnel are working closely with local authorities, specifically the White Sands National Park staff, to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the public and first responders, and to protect the integrity of the crash site.

The White Sands National Park remains open to visitors however, the area past mile marker 3 is closed. All patrons are advised to avoid the area for their safety and to preserve the integrity of the investigation. An investigation conducted by a board of qualified officers is underway to determine the cause of the incident.
