Retirees/Dependents

Question: My child usually goes to the Child Development Center at Holloman. When can they start going back?

Answer: If you are unable to provide care to your child, Holloman's Child Development and Youth Centers are open, but we are asking everyone not explicitly requiring childcare due to both parents (or a single parent) working to stay home with their kids if possible. We want to keep the limited number of childcare spots for our first responders, our security personnel, and our medical professionals as much as possible. Each case will be examined individually though. Additionally, understand that if you or your child have been outside of the local area, they may need additional screening before they will be admitted. Question: Are retirees allowed on Base?

Answer: Yes, but temporarily that access has been limited to just the Holloman Medical Clinic. The goal of this temporary limitation to our base is to keep the number of people accessing the base and interacting with the base population to an absolute minimum, in line with state, national and Department of Defense guidance. Our retiree community is the most at risk population, and we want to ensure we do our best to protect them. Retirees living on base will still have access to the Commissary providing proper verification of their on base address.
