Below are the actions taken at Holloman AFB during the month of October 2016.

Courts-Martial:

- An Airman First Class, 49th Logistics Readiness Squadron, was court-martialed for Sexual Assault. A panel of officer and enlisted members found the member not guilty.

Article 15 Actions:

- A Senior Airman, 49th Medical Support Squadron, received an Article 15 for dereliction of duty in assigned tasks. The member received a suspended reduction to the grade of Airman First Class, forfeiture of \$208.00 pay per month for two months, and a reprimand.

Administrative Discharges:

- An Airman First Class, 49th Operations Support Squadron, was discharged for Conditions that Interfere with Military Service. Member received an Honorable discharge.
- An Airman First Class, 49th Medical Support Squadron, was discharged for Conditions that Interfere with Military Service. Member received an Honorable discharge.
- An Airman First Class, 49th Medical Support Squadron, was discharged for Drug Abuse. Member received an Under Honorable Conditions (General) discharge.
- An Airman First Class, 49th Maintenance Squadron, was discharged for Failure to Progress in Military Training. Member received an Honorable discharge.
- An Airman Basic, 49th Civil Engineering Squadron, was discharged for Failure in Alcohol Abuse Treatment and A Pattern of Misconduct. Member received an Under Honorable Conditions (General) discharge.

Administrative Demotions:

- None.

Tip of the Month:

- Per the Federal Joint Travel Regulations (JTR), for military members who are discharged, resigned, separated from the service under honorable conditions, retired, or receiving temporary disability retirement, such personnel action is considered a permanent change of station (PCS).
